4. Housing for beamline users at COMPRES-supported beamlines at the ALS and the NSLS

Starting a few years ago, the ExComm approved a budget item for housing in dormitory-level accommodations for users at the COMPRES-supported beamlines at the NSLS and the ALS.

This nominal budget item was for \$20K per year for all beamlines, but this limit has been exceeded in recent years.

There is no doubt, according to feedback we have received, that this type of support is very much appreciated by the users of our beamlines. Note that GSECARS at the APS does NOT provide such housing support.

To date, this offer of housing support has extended to ALL users of the beamlines we support, irrespective of field of research [Earth sciences, materials science,etc] or whether the user comes from a COMPRES member institution.

The ExComm discussed whether this support should be restricted to users from member institutions of COMPRES and/or to users with Earth science projects.

The ExComm requested that Liebermann draft a new policy for further discussion and also provide information on the costs of such housing at Brookhaven, Argonne and Lawrence Berkeley labs.

5. Advisory Council joint meeting with ExComm in June 2010 at Skamania
For the past few years, it has been our custom to hold a joint meeting of he Advisory
Council and the Executive Committee in conjunction with the Annual Meeting.
In recent years, we have scheduled this joint meeting on the afternoon preceding the
arrival of most of the attendees. In 2009 at Bretton Woods, we did not start until 4 PM
and were still talking when the welcoming reception began.

On Nov 12, Liebermann wrote to the Advisory Council [Kao, Garnero, Heaney, Jephcoat, Kellogg, McDonough] to ascertain their preference for the meeting at Skamania in June 2010. Several of the members preferred a joint session after the formal annual meeting.
